Technology & Equipment Grant

Up to \$20K

Due May 31st

Nonprofits apply on the OFB Submittable website

\$400K will be awarded to 20-30 nonprofits

Technology: Hardware like laptops, cameras, printers, scanners. Software like computer programs, website development, subscriptions.

Equipment and Machinery: Fixed assets for your business, not intended for resale, like furniture, appliances, tools, materials, etc.



Thelma Gibson Health Initiative, based in Coconut Grove, provides skills training and wraparound supports.

The equipment microgrant is being used to support their culinary job training kitchen by purchasing an industrial stove, refrigerator/freezer, and food prep equipment.



Fruit of Life LLC, based in Overtown, produces functional collagen infused beverages under the brand “VOUCHE”

The equipment microgrant is being used to purchase industrial beverage machinery, such as an espresso maker, cooler, industrial blender, and more.

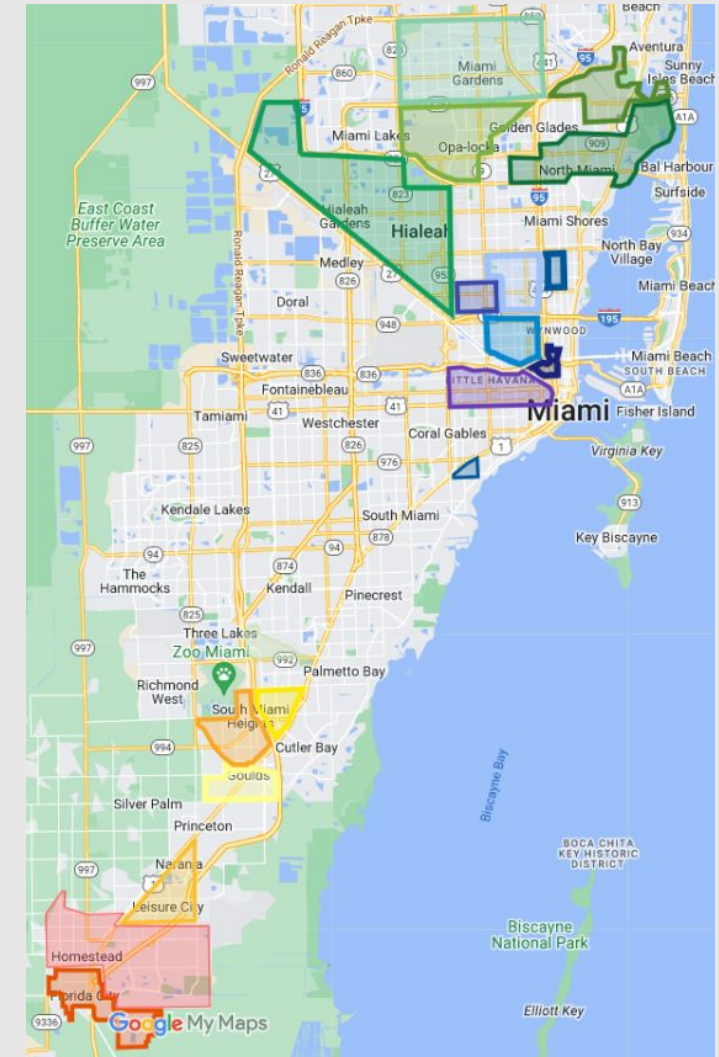

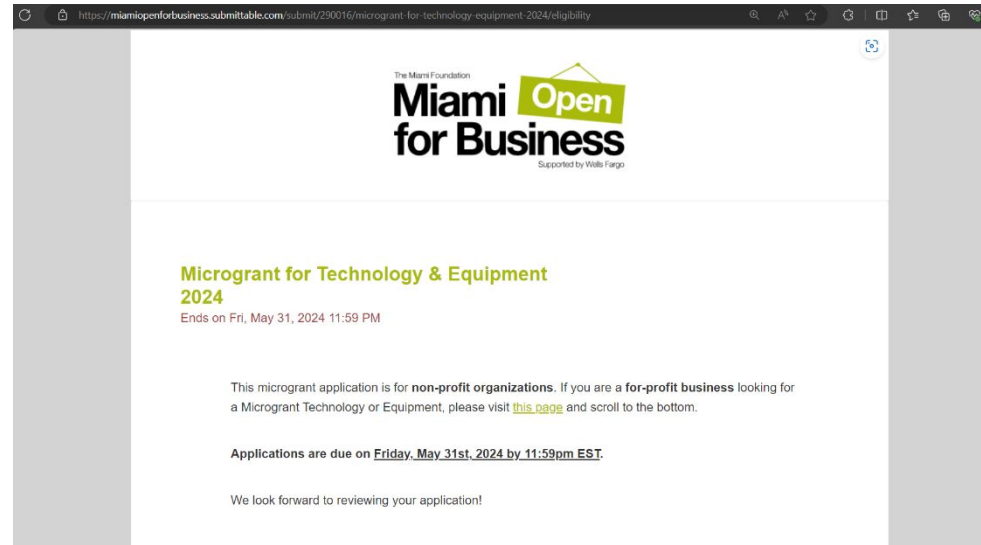

Common reasons applications do not score as high

- **Disregarding eligibility** / pre-qualification requirements
 - More than \$1M in revenue
 - Not owned by historically underserved entrepreneur
 - Not based in Miami-Dade County
 - Not operational for at least 2 years
- Requesting funding for **non-allowable categories** (salaries, rent, etc.)
 - Requesting a microgrant to buy vehicles
 - Requesting a loan to pay for technology
 - Requesting CREO funding for renovations on already-owned building
- **Lack of specificity** in funding request
 - “Scanners” vs “HD Epson V850 Pro Photo Scanners (3@ \$1,500 = \$4,500)”
- Could **not articulate impact** of funding in narrative questions

Example Response from Small Business Proposal

Purpose: Describe in more detail the proposed use of funds. Please include specifics about the item(s) you plan to purchase, how you will acquire them, and deploy them in your organization.

Response from a High Scoring Proposal

We intend to purchase 65 Dell Chrome 3110 laptops at a current unit cost of \$263 or total cost of \$17095; MacBook Pro 13" from Apple (for administrative use in STEM activities)-\$1200; 1- Pochar C30BH Charging Cart \$600 for 30 laptops and 1 Pochar C18-T Charging Cart \$400 for 18 laptops Pochar for a total cost of \$1000 and related software. The laptops will allow us to substantially increase our current device inventory, but also replace outdated devices that we've had for over 7 years. The additional charging carts would give us the ability to store 78 laptops when added to our current charging cart. All the foregoing equipment will be used by our 60 plus students in our After-School and 80 plus students in our Summer Camp. We also intend to use the devices in the weekly classes we are planning for the seniors in our community. If the foregoing items are not available at the time of the grant disbursement, we will use our best efforts to purchase comparable products at comparable pricing.

Response from a Low Scoring Proposal

We want to revamp some things that are really old and use more of the new stuff and have a better look and feel.

We want the kids to have the robotics and coding program, but at this point we are even over our budget to buy anything else and we really need the help.

Our children, some of them (25%) receive funds from the government and it is not easy for them to have a chance outside of our center.

Please help us help this new generation.

2024 Funding Cycle

- **Technology and Equipment Microgrant**
 - Opened on Friday 3/1
 - Closes on Friday 5/31
 - Notified in July
- **ABLE Loan Fund**
 - Opened on Friday 3/1
 - Closes on Monday 9/30
 - Notified within 8-10 business days
- **Collective Real Estate Ownership**
 - Due by 4/15
 - Notified by the end of following month
 - Example: Apply by 4/15, notified by 5/31



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
